<b>Activity Narrative Report</b>	<p>In line with our continuous efforts to strengthen community emergency preparedness and ensure an efficient, coordinated response to crises, a First Responder Orientation and Training was successfully conducted by the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office . The activity was spearheaded by Action Officer <b>Rashman Nazer D. Lim</b>, with key support from <b>Research and Planning Officer Amirah L. Juanday</b> and <b>Peace Program Officer Reyuard B. Jose</b>.</p> <p>The training aimed to equip participants with the fundamental knowledge and skills required to act effectively and safely as first responders during emergencies. The orientation also emphasized inter-agency coordination, community-based risk management, and the importance of a unified command system.</p> <p>The main objectives of the training were to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Orient participants on the roles and responsibilities of first responders.</li> <li>Enhance skills in basic emergency response, including first aid, evacuation procedures, and situational assessment.</li> <li>Promote inter-agency collaboration and establish communication protocols during emergency incidents.</li> <li>Foster resilience and readiness among community-based responders.</li> </ol> <p>Participants showed high levels of engagement throughout the training. The simulation exercises demonstrated improved response time, effective teamwork, and proper application of learned techniques. Feedback from attendees indicated a significant increase in confidence and knowledge in managing emergency situations.</p> <p>The First Responder Orientation and Training was a resounding success, achieving its objectives of raising awareness, building capacity, and promoting collaboration among community stakeholders. It is recommended that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Follow-up training be conducted periodically to reinforce skills.</li> </ul>

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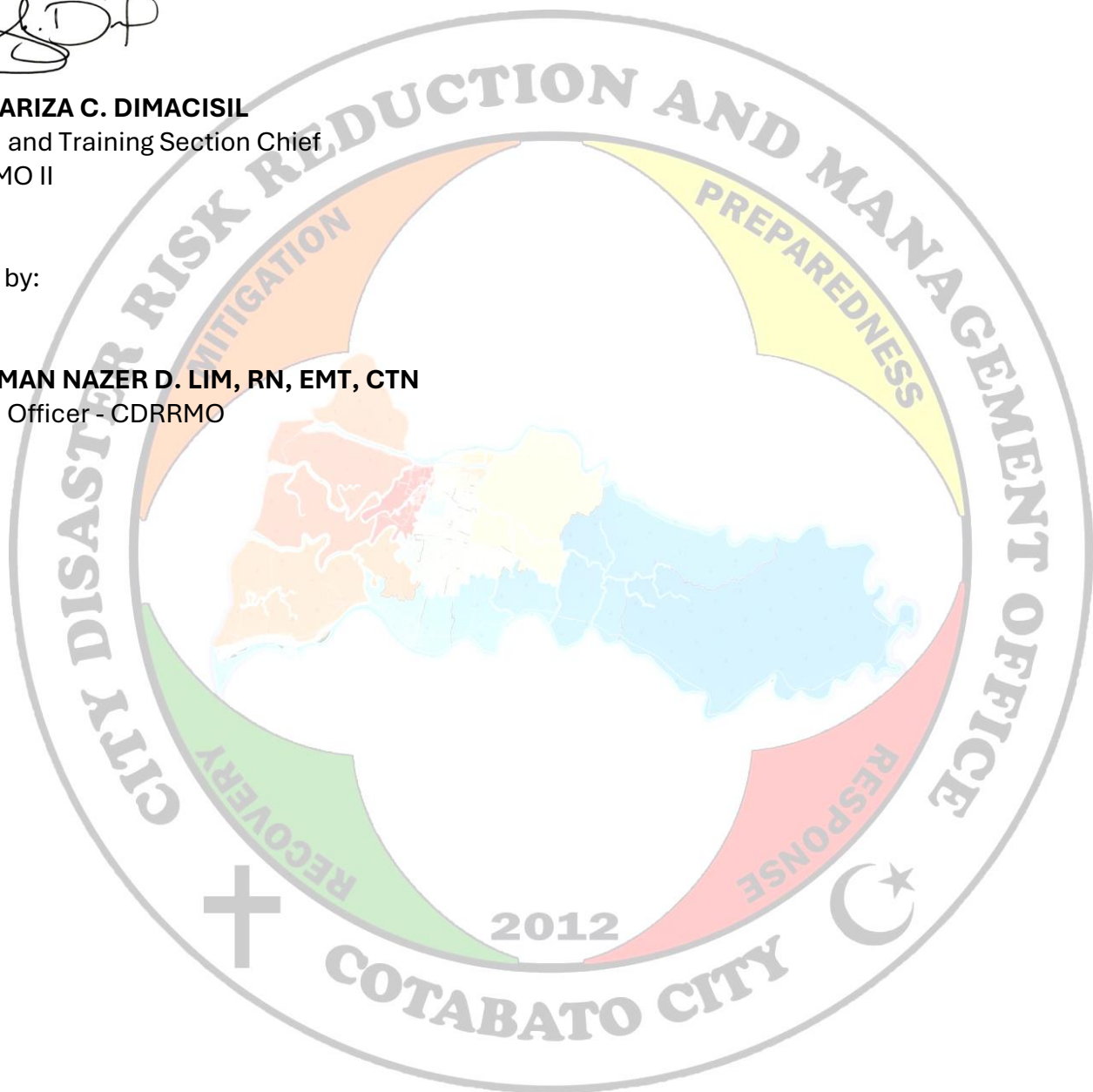
- Advanced modules be developed for specialized response roles.

<b>Activity Narrative Report</b>	<p>In pursuit of strengthening community health resilience and enhancing emergency response capabilities, the <b>Davao Regional Medical Center (DRMC)</b> successfully conducted a <b>Standard First Aid Training and Pre-Hospital Trauma Care</b> program. This vital training initiative was spearheaded by our <b>Action Officer Rashman Nazer D. Lim</b>, whose leadership and commitment to public service played a significant role in the success of the event.</p> <p>The training was designed to provide participants with practical knowledge and skills necessary to respond to various medical emergencies and traumatic incidents, especially during the critical pre-hospital phase.</p> <p>The training featured a combination of lectures, demonstrations, and hands-on exercises. It was facilitated by a team of skilled medical professionals from DRMC, with support and supervision from Action Officer Rashman Nazer D. Lim.</p> <p>A total of <b>48 participants</b> completed the training and were awarded certificates of participation and completion.</p> <p>Participants came from various sectors including City Health Office, Persons with Disability, City Mayors’ Office and from Public Safety Office.</p> <p>The sessions were interactive, with enthusiastic engagement from all attendees.</p> <p>Participants gave highly positive feedback, emphasizing the training's relevance and its potential to save lives. Many expressed a desire for continued education and refresher courses in emergency care.</p> <p>The <b>Standard First Aid Training and Pre-Hospital Trauma Care</b> conducted by the <b>Davao Regional Medical Center</b>, under the dynamic leadership of <b>Action Officer Rashman Nazer D. Lim</b>, was a well-organized and impactful event. It significantly enhanced the emergency preparedness of all participants and contributed to building a more responsive and safety-conscious community.</p>



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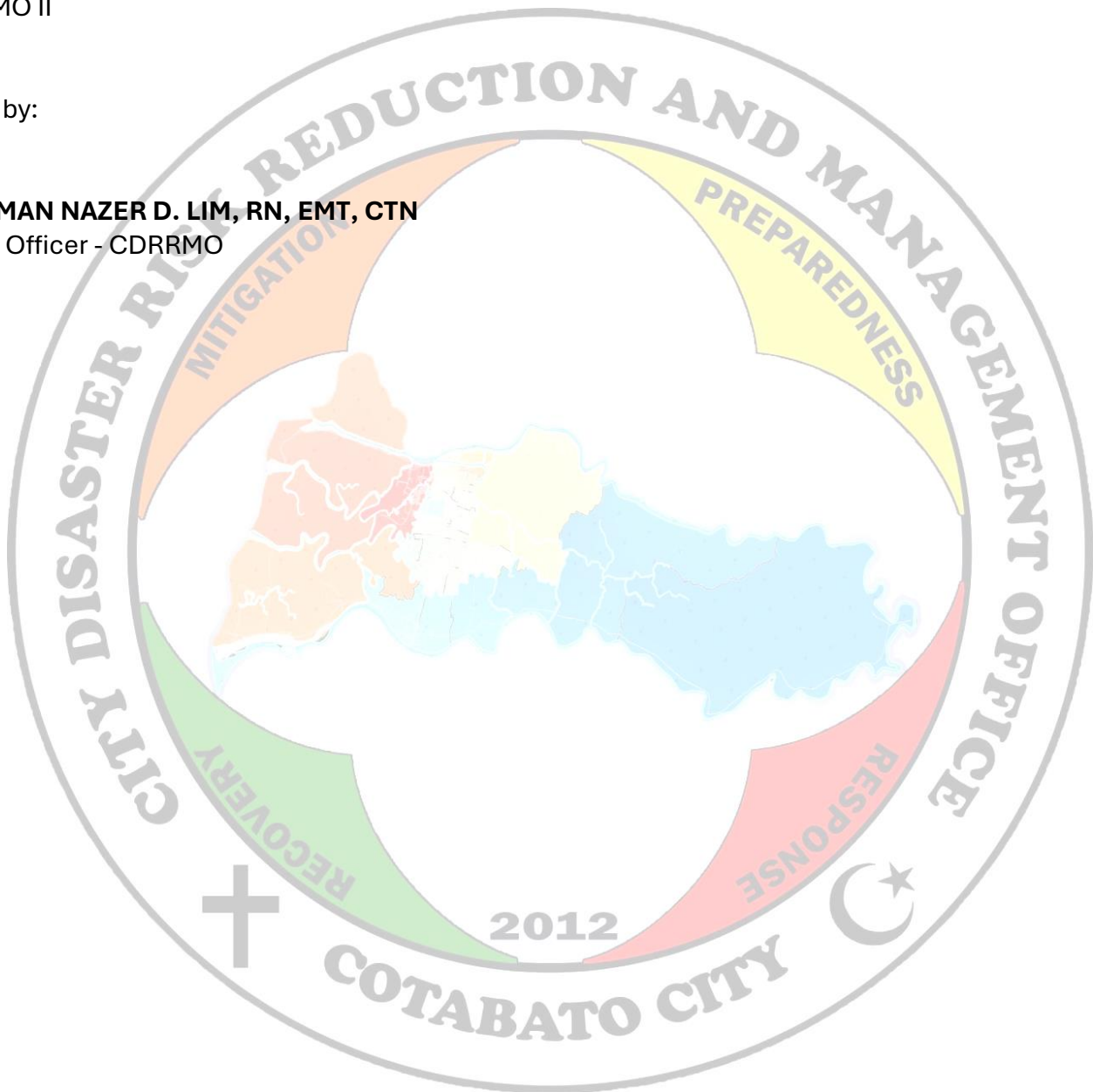


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
