Title of the Activity	DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT ORIENTATION TO 37 BARANGAYS
Date Implemented	August 7 to 29, 2025
Rationale	<p>In line with the mandate of Republic Act No. 10121, also known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010, the [Municipality/City] Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (DRRMO) conducted a series of DRRM orientations for the 37 barangays under its jurisdiction. The activity aimed to strengthen community preparedness, enhance the knowledge of barangay officials and volunteers on DRRM concepts, and ensure the readiness of every barangay in addressing disaster-related risks.</p>
Activity Narrative Report	<p>II. Objectives</p> <p>The primary objectives of the DRRM orientation were:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. To familiarize barangay officials, committee members, and volunteers with the basic concepts, principles, and legal mandates of DRRM.2. To ensure that each barangay understands its roles and responsibilities before, during, and after disaster events.3. To encourage the establishment or enhancement of Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committees (BDRRMCs).4. To promote community-based preparedness measures and integrate them into local planning. <p>III. Activity Details</p> <p>Date Conducted: August 7 to 29, 2025 Venue: All 37 Barangays of Cotabato City Participants: Barangay Captains, BDRRMC members, barangay volunteers, youth representatives, and other stakeholders from 37 barangays.</p> <p>The orientation covered the following topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Overview of Republic Act 10121 and its implementing rules.• Introduction to the four thematic areas of DRRM:<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Prevention and Mitigation2. Preparedness



3. Response

4. Rehabilitation and Recovery

- Roles and responsibilities of Barangay DRRM Committees.
- Development and updating of the Barangay DRRM Plan (BDRRMP).
- Early warning systems, evacuation planning, and hazard mapping.
- Coordination mechanisms between barangays and the Municipal/City DRRMO.

IV. Highlights of Implementation

- All 37 barangays successfully participated in the orientation.
- Active engagement and open discussions during the Q&A sessions.
- Several barangays presented their existing DRRM initiatives and identified areas for improvement.
- DRRMO distributed reference materials, including hazard maps and DRRM guidebooks, to each barangay.
- Commitment from barangay leaders to update their BDRRMPs and strengthen emergency response teams.

V. Observations

- Barangay officials expressed high interest in DRRM topics, especially on evacuation planning and first aid.
- Some barangays require technical assistance in hazard mapping and risk assessment.
- There is a need to conduct follow-up training on simulation drills and emergency response.

VI. Recommendations

- Conduct capacity-building programs for Barangay Emergency Response Teams (BERTs).
- Provide regular refresher orientations for barangay officials and volunteers, especially after leadership changes.
- Allocate funds for DRRM equipment and supplies to support barangay operations during emergencies.

VII. Conclusion

The DRRM orientation for the 37 barangays was successfully conducted and met its objectives of raising awareness, enhancing knowledge, and strengthening local disaster preparedness. Through sustained collaboration between the DRRMO, barangay leaders, and the community, the municipality/city will be better equipped to face future disasters and emergencies.

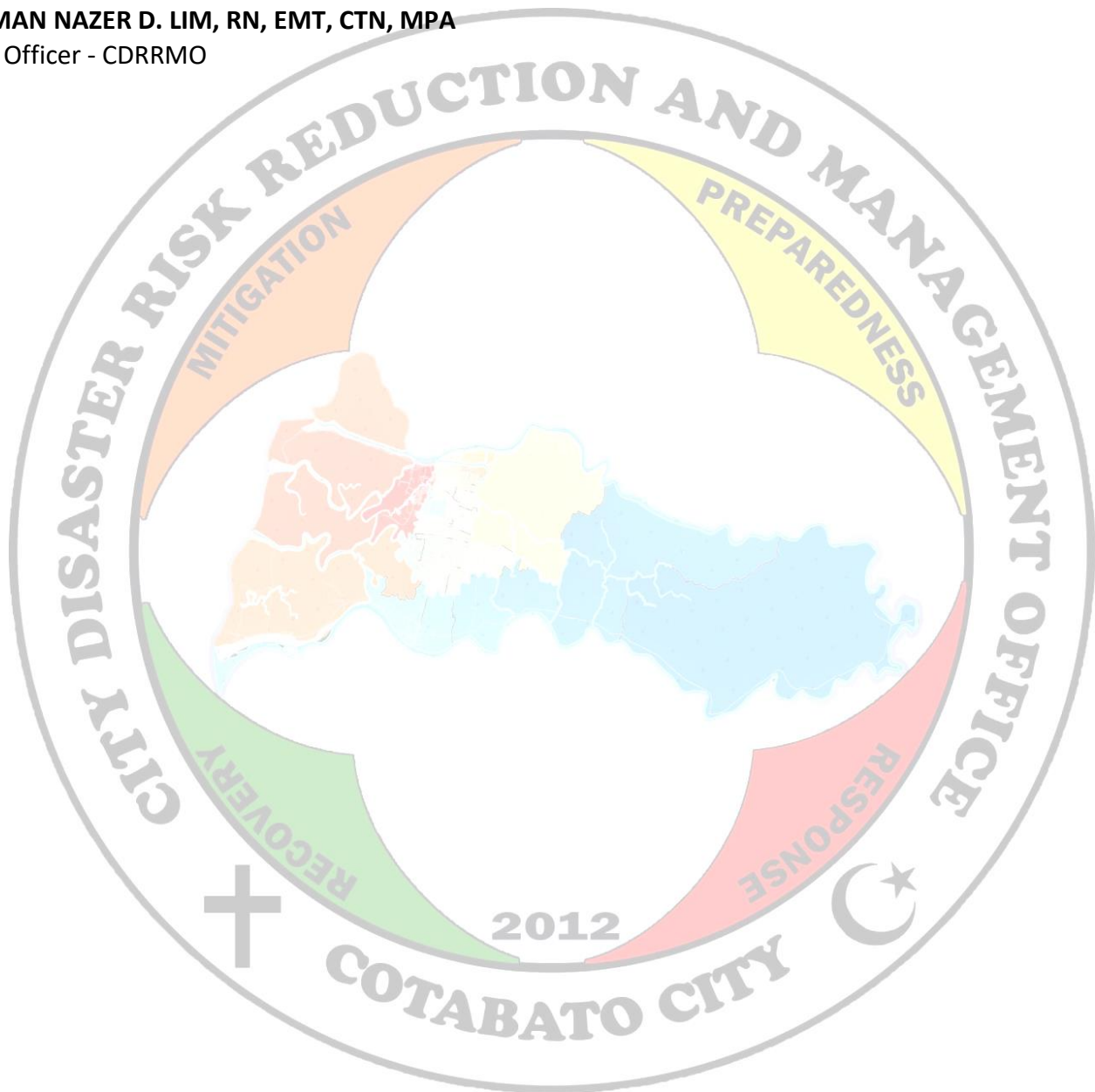

Title of the Activity	FIRE DRILL ACTIVITY AT POBLACION 7
Date Implemented	August 28, 2025
Rationale	<p>City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office's (CDRRMO) mandate to promote disaster preparedness and safety awareness, a Fire Drill Activity was conducted on August 29, 2025, at 10:00 AM in Poblacion 7. The activity aimed to enhance the knowledge and skills of the community in responding effectively to fire emergencies and to strengthen the coordination between residents and emergency responders.</p>
Activity Narrative Report	<p>II. Objectives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• To orient the community on fire safety, evacuation procedures, and emergency response.• To assess the preparedness of residents in case of a fire incident.• To enhance the coordination and response time of the CDRRMO, Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Barangay Officials, and other stakeholders.• To instill awareness and discipline among community members during fire-related emergencies.
	<p>III. Activity Details</p> <p>Date Conducted: August 8, 2025 Venue: Poblacion 7, Cotabato City Participants: All constituents of Barangay Poblacion 7, BFP, CCPO, RedCross, Public Information Office, CTTMC, Public Safety Office, OHS - HEMS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The drill started with a short orientation led by the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), focusing on fire prevention tips, proper use of fire extinguishers, and safe evacuation procedures.• A fire alarm simulation was initiated, and residents of Poblacion 7 actively participated by following the evacuation plan and moving to the designated safe area.• Firefighters demonstrated fire suppression techniques, while CDRRMO personnel facilitated crowd control and ensured safety throughout the drill.• Barangay officials assisted in disseminating instructions and guiding participants to safety zones.



- An **evaluation and debriefing** session was conducted after the drill, identifying strengths and areas for improvement in the community's fire emergency response.

IV. Highlights of Implementation

- All 37 barangays successfully participated in the orientation.
- Active engagement and open discussions during the Q&A sessions.
- Several barangays presented their existing DRRM initiatives and identified areas for improvement.
- DRRMO distributed reference materials, including hazard maps and DRRM guidebooks, to each barangay.
- Commitment from barangay leaders to update their BDRRM Plans and strengthen emergency response teams.

V. Observations

- The residents responded promptly and followed the evacuation procedures.
- Coordination among the CDRRMO, BFP, and Barangay Officials was effective and well-executed.
- Minor lapses were noted in crowd movement, highlighting the need for continuous drills and orientation.
- Overall, the activity demonstrated the community's increasing awareness and readiness in dealing with fire incidents.

VI. Recommendations

The **Fire Drill Activity at Poblacion 7** was successfully conducted and met its objectives of raising fire safety awareness and strengthening disaster preparedness at the community level. The active participation of residents and stakeholders reflected their commitment to safety and resilience.

It is recommended that:

1. Regular fire drills be conducted to reinforce knowledge and preparedness.
2. Continuous information dissemination on fire safety and disaster preparedness be implemented.
3. Collaboration among agencies and barangay units be sustained to ensure effective emergency response.

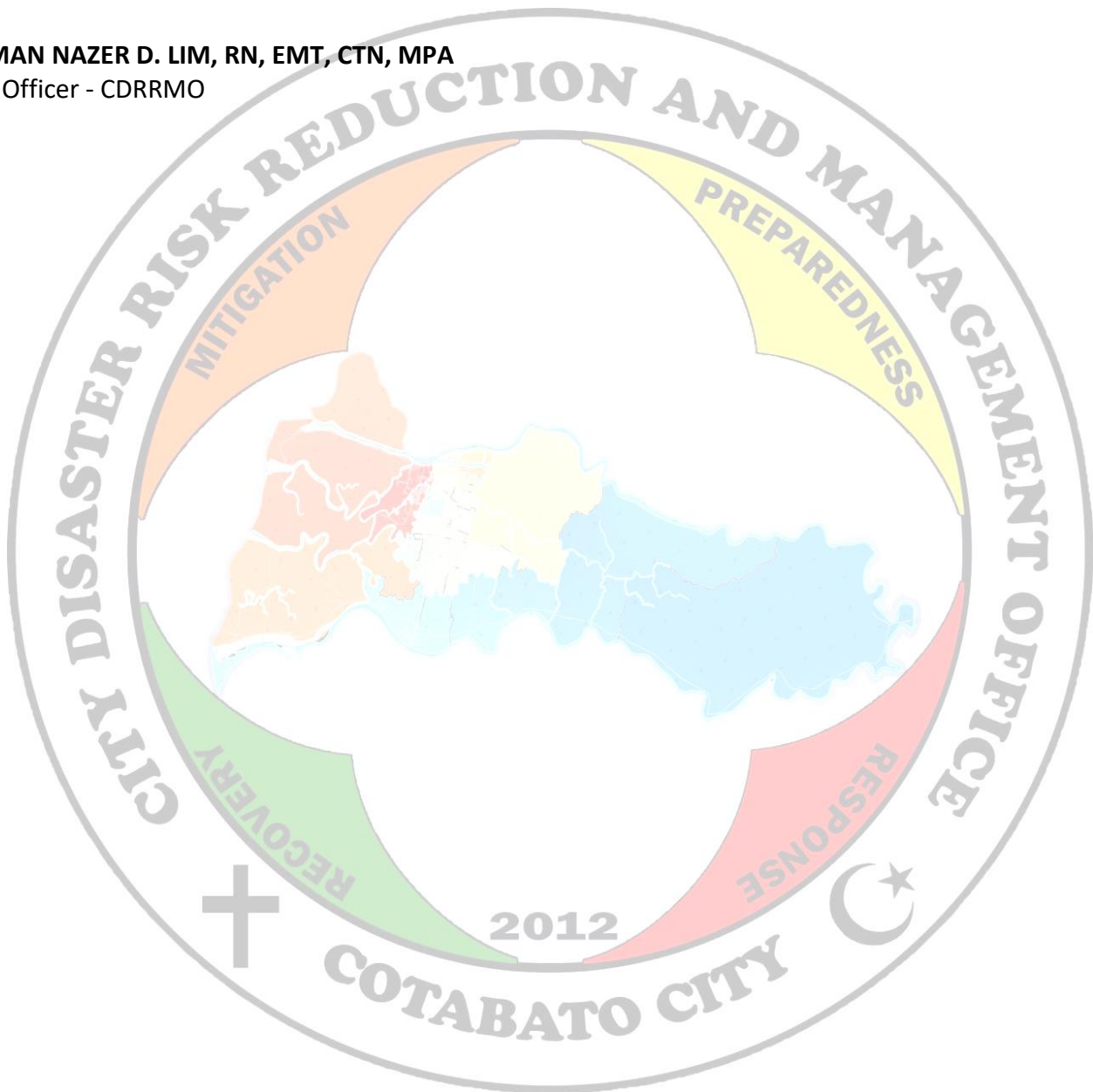

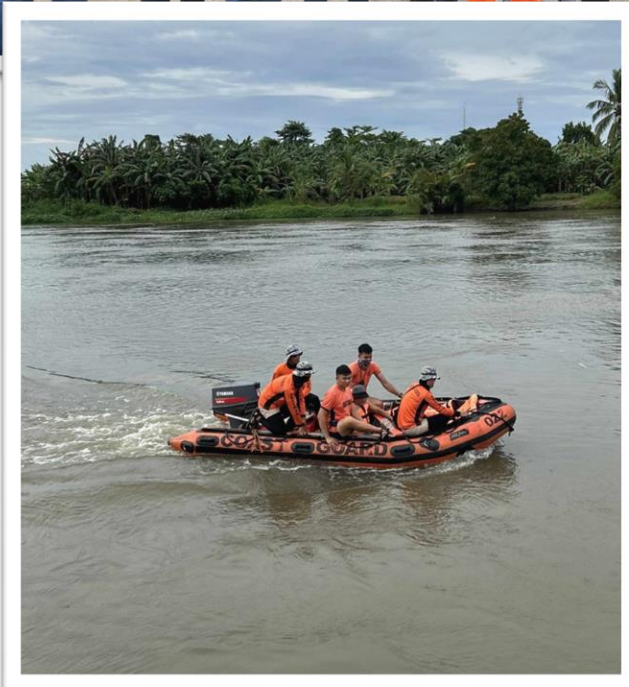

The activity was spearheaded by the Bangsamoro Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council in collaboration with various government agencies, humanitarian organizations, and local stakeholders. The BDRP aims to provide a unified and coordinated framework for disaster preparedness, response, and recovery across the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region.</p>
